IMPORTANCE, AIMS AND POSSIBLE OUTCOME OF RESEARCH

The objective of this research is to examine how sentimental, overindulgent pet ownership and the misinterpretation of canine needs impact dog welfare. We hypothesize that excessive anthropomorphism and emotional over-attachment may lead to health issues, separation anxiety, and behavioral disorders in dogs. Utilizing both qualitative and quantitative methods—alongside behavioral and physiological measurements—the study analyzes stress levels in dogs and their owners, as well as their adaptation to urban environments. The expected findings may contribute to refining guidelines for responsible dog ownership, support decision-making related to urban pet keeping, and promote the development of healthier human-canine relationships.
